I know its a state highway and that presents obstacles but do we really need a 5 mile long highway running through several of our neighborhoods? It's a great divide for those on foot. And all the plans for transit oriented development on Hiawatha - who wants to live on a highway? I think much less money should be devoted to car-focused streets, and much more to transit and bike facilities. Four-lane roads should be converted to three-lane wherever possible.

And all the plans for transit oriented development on Hiawatha - who wants to live on a highway? What if we changed it into a 2 lane parkway with speed limits of 25 miles an hour, a wide strip of green in the middle and street parking? Imagine how much better that would be for the community.</p> <p>And street signals - why are so many automatically 'don't walk' on green, leaving it to the pedestrian to push the button if they want a walk signal? How does that prioritize the pedestrian? I also think we should have cross walks at all intersections on main roads - otherwise drivers don't think they need to stop. Drivers need more prompts.</p> <p>In 2040, I'd like to see this city making strides to accommodate more than car traffic. Looking at it with fresh eyes, not just redoing our streets, but re-imagining them. Do we want our aging population driving, or living in communities that allow them to get what they need without needing a car? And our kids too, they should have lots of options on how to get where they need to go.</p>
